#### PASTOR'S MOMENT

At the risk of sounding mundane, I'd like to talk about our recent weather for a bit. I know, talking about the weather is the first sign that you've officially got nothing to really talk about and just need a safe topic to say something about. Well, I hope that isn't the case here and given our recent abrupt shift from chilly postwinter to full-on 90+ degree summer-feeling days I think I'll

risk simply talking about the weather with you.

We have certainly been having a strange Spring in terms of weather, with large fluctuations in temperature and types of precipitation. The picture above is a pretty good representation of conditions lately. Spring is always looked

forward to as a welcome transition from the cold and dark of Winter, but we always seem to forget that it brings with it changeable and unpredictable weather and with the beauty of new life witnessed in the blooming of God's creation comes that dreaded harbinger of seasonal allergies; pollen. Spring is a time of transition and that means a certain level of discomfort. Even amidst the excitement of change and welcoming new and positive things into our lives

like warmer weather and the beauty of blossoming flowers we wrestle with frustration at our inability to dictate the form or magnitude of the change we experience. It is so often completely out of our hands. The only thing we completely control is how prepared we are to adapt. Do we have an umbrella and sunglasses; sunscreen and a jacket that is warm enough but not too warm and also waterproof but sufficiently breathable? When, exactly is the prefect date to switch from winter to summer tires?

Our experience of expectation and inevitable frustration with Springtime as a time of transition, of changeable conditions is a good reminder that our spiritual experience is not so different. We go through many times of transition and change throughout our journeys of faith; times of abundance and growth, times of distance and doubt, times of intimacy and closeness with God, and everything in between. While we cannot hope to be so completely prepared for all the conditions we may face along our spiritual paths in life, (any more than we can be fully prepared for any conditions of an Oregon Spring) we can, with the help of God, foster an ability to adapt and seek help when we need it. We can, as followers of Jesus, lean into trusting in God that we will be ok. It's o.k. if it begins to rain and we don't have an umbrella. It will be sunny again in half an hour anyway. It's ok if we aren't prepared for every transition that may come. Conditions are bound to change again. This is how we learn and grow; not when things stay static and never change, but when they do.

sign up volunteers. Check out the sign-up sheet on the bulletin board in the Narthex or see Evelyn Hughes for more details.


#### KEIZER COMMUNITY DINNER

#### KEIZER **COMMUNITY** FOOD BANK

I hope you all had a chance to read the article about the food bank in last week's Keizer Times. In a letter from MPPS they stated that "March was the single busiest month on record for our pantry network. There were 18,196 visits to food pantries, more than any month during the pandemic and a 32 percent increase over January and February. This message is stunning but not surprising to anyone who is working on the front lines of a food pantry. April and May numbers have continued to show elevated need."

KCFB continues to be able to purchase items to help fill in some of the gaps through generous donations, but we purchase them from local sources, making the cost higher. If you chose to give food, or a donation to KCFB, or KCC for the food bank, I will use to purchase food items.

Yesterday was another busy night, hot too! We served 68 families. There always seems to be one late comer as we are exiting for the evening, but for some reason as I fill a box with whatever we have left, to someone who really needs food and is so grateful, it reminds me that this is why we keep coming to serve.
