PASTOR'S MOMENT

One of the best parts about living in the Northwest is our

proximity to impressive examples of God's creation. We never have to look far to be reminded that God is near. With that proximity, though, often comes a certain desensitizing to just how amazing nature is sometimes, to just how



much we can learn about God just by looking around. In all fairness we kind of have to turn a blind eye sometimes to the majesty of it all in order to function. If we were fully aware of God's presence surrounding us all the time, everywhere we looked, it would be overwhelming, right? So, we trick ourselves into thinking it is all sort of

mundane, it's just trees and mountains and valleys and stuff. The lives we have created don't often afford us the time to simply revel and rest in nature, to feel the presence of God near, to see it right in front of us.

Kids, though, kids haven't grown that filter yet. They haven't yet learned to turn off that view of the world. I was reminded of this recently when I took my son into the woods for some father-son time, just exploring and enjoying nature together like I remembered doing with my father and grandfather as a kid. I was excited to show him the things about nature that I enjoyed, the simple joy of the sights and smells and feel of the outdoors. I wasn't planning on it being a spiritual experience, I mean, he's not even 4 years old. I didn't expect him to connect the majesty of nature with the presence of God, so I didn't bring it up but he did.

There we were, standing on a landing a thousand feet above the canyon floor looking out over the fire-burned landscape towards Mount Hood. You could just see the gleaming white summit peaking through the surrounding ridgelines of desolate, burned out forest. I handed over my binoculars, telling him about when my dad had given them to me as a kid and he seemed excited to use them. As soon as he looked through them towards the mountain he exclaimed, "I see heaven! I can see God!" I chuckled and said, "Wow! That's awesome!" Then he asked me where God is and I said, "Everywhere." and he said, "How?" and I said, "It's a mystery." and he said, "Oh. OK." It was as simple as that. The mysteries of the universe witnessed and accepted. God keeping God's promise to always be with us. Thank you, son, for the reminder.

20% per bag. We will be stockpiling them


for now and turn them in when the promotion starts in November. Please turn them in by **November 30th!**

SERMON SERIES

Fall Series 3: The Good News About Death

While we speak of death often at funerals, we rarely tackle the subject head on in our Sunday routine. Yet at the core of the Christian faith is a word about death and life beyond death. If the book sales of "Heaven is for Real" and others in the genre are any indication, people are hungry for a word of life in the midst of death. This series is a wonderful opportunity to speak openly about death and the Christian hope of resurrection and perhaps clear up some of society's misguided notions at the same time.

November 5—Sermon: "The Other Side of the Curtain" Revelations 7:9-17 We remember those who came before us, and we worship knowing death is not the end.

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 November 12—Sermon: "Grieving with Hope" We grieve in the paradox between human loss and eternal life.

Nov 19—Sermon: "How Many Shopping Days Left" Psalms 90:1-12 Life is a gift; use it wisely.

November 26—Sermon: "The Last Word" Ephesians 1:15-23 No Matter what life (and death) bring, Christ has the last word.
