
ADVENT DEVOTIONALS



The Keizer Network of Women (K.N.O.W.) coordinate and facilitate this annual Giving program. The K.N.O.W. are business owners and employees of members who participate in community projects facilitated by the Keizer Chamber of Commerce.

Keizer has 10 public schools. Five elementary, two middle, and one high school. K.N.O.W. also serves Simonka Place, Oriole House, Chemeketa Early College Program, and Keizer Head Start. The Giving Basket Committee works with staff within each school to identify students in need. Those students will each receive one gift and one item of need, up to \$60 per student.

In addition to the gift boxes, each student/family will receive a full box of non-perishable food and a bag of potatoes, onions, beans, a fruit (usually apples) and a family size ham.

They are always looking for partners to support this annual event. They have sponsors who purchase one of each of the following items: Peanut Butter, Jam/Jelly, Ham, Potatoes, Onions, Beans, Apples.

The plot twists and ends in a cliffhanger that invites us to wonder how we are called to participate in the story.
