PASTOR'S MOMENT

Well, were almost there, folks! That's right, the end of Lent is nigh upon us. Holy Week begins this Sunday with Palm Sunday and celebrating Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Like most things Jesus did, he did it in an untypical, unexpected, and very specific to his purpose fashion. Holy Week marks the culmination and destination of this season of preparation. Consequently, we, much like our forebears, tend to build up a lot of expectation around the coming of Jesus, then and now and in the future. While that excitement and expectation is certainly warranted, we would do well to, at the same time, recognize that Jesus came then in an expectation-defying manner, and he will very likely continue to do so. One of our core expectations surrounding Jesus should always be the expectation to be surprised.

The very idea of expecting to be surprised would seem to be a contradiction, since it wouldn't really be a surprise if you were

expecting it, would it? I suppose what I'm really saying is have your expectations, retain your hope for what the coming of Jesus into the world and into your life and the lives of others will mean, and at the same time be ready for those hopes and expectations to be surpassed or even seemingly ignored for something better.




The point of all our preparation is not merely to be ready to receive what we can imagine for ourselves in the coming of Jesus, but what God can imagine. Holy Week and Easter are something we celebrate every year and as such we run the risk of the practical functions of the celebrations becoming routine. We fool ourselves into thinking we have it all sorted out; the services, and the meals, the egg hunts, and the Sunday school lessons. This Holy Week and Easter, let us take some of our organizational energy and use it to open up a significant portion of ourselves to the possibility of being surprised. As we prepare to celebrate Christ's sacrifice and resurrection and promise of new life, remember how surprising it all truly is, that God loves us this much, that God covenants with us to this degree and will never stop loving us.



MEN'S GROUP





The fee is \$5 per group, per day for use of KCC toys and cleaning supplies. Play time for your group is between 9 am and noon on the reserved day with up to ½ hour afterwards allotted for cleanup. Each group must clean and sanitize all toys, equipment, and tables used during their play time.

SERMON SERIES

Easter Series

When thinking about what makes a person a Christian, we often start with belief. Someone confesses faith in Jesus, then learns what is expected of his or her behavior as a Christian, and finally the persons finds belonging in a community with other Christians. But Jesus didn't work that way, nor does that pattern work for many on the outskirts of the church today. In this Easter series we explore the ways in which Christ lived out a gospel of homecoming and modeled the primary need for and power of belonging, even before we know what exactly we believe or how we are to behave.

March 31-Sermon: "Insider Knowledge"

John 20:1-18

Mary didn't recognize the risen Christ until she heard her name and she knew he was known.

April 7—Sermon: "In Defense of Doubt"

John 20:19-31

The strength of our faith does not come from certainty; it is forged in the furnace of doubt.

April 14—Sermon: "Eating with Ghosts"

Luke 24:36b-48

Jesus meets his sacred disciples with an invitation to fellowship.

April 21—Sermon: "When You Say Nothing at All"

Psalm 23

Sometimes the most powerful way to communicate belonging is to say nothing and simply be present.

April 28—Sermon: "Follow the Verbs"

Acts 8:26-40

Philip and the Ethiopian eunuch show us how to walk with "the other" on the road to belonging.

May 5—Sermon: "When Jesus Interrupts"

Acts 10:44-48

Jesus continues to interrupt and rearrange our understanding and ordering of salvation.
