

#### SERMON SERIES

## Summer Series 1: God at Work, cont.

June 30—Sermon: "God Saves"

2 Samuel 1:1, 17-27

Even in times of grief, God brings light out of darkness.

July 7-Sermon: "God Unites"

2 Samuel 5:1-5, 9-10

David leads his army to occupy Jerusalem, but it is God that brings victory.

## Summer Series 2: No Longer Strangers

This walk through the letter to the Ephesians teaches the church how to be a community worthy of the gospel. In the midst of familiar interpersonal conflicts, the write of Ephesians reminds them they are "now in Christ Jesus," no longer strangers to God and, importantly, no longer alienated from each other. Because of this new life in Christ, they are experiencing a radical transformation of their identity—as individuals and as a community. These six weeks explore, what it looks like to live rooted in reconciliation, vertical and horizontal—with God and with neighbors.

July 14—Sermon: "The Family"

Ephesians 1:3-14

God chose us to be adopted together as a family in Christ.

July 21—Sermon: "Aliens Brought Near"

Ephesians 2:11-32

God reconciles divided peoples in a politically subversive act.
