the foundation of the experience, our faith in Christ and the desire to model that faith for young people and encourage them to build (and continue building) their own relationship with Jesus.



COFFEE FELLOWSHIP TIME







SERMON SERIES

Summer Series 2: No Longer Strangers, cont.

This walk through the letter to the Ephesians teaches the church how to be a community worthy of the gospel. In the midst of familiar interpersonal conflicts, the writer of Ephesians reminds them they are "now in Christ Jesus," no longer strangers to God and, importantly, no longer alienated from each other. Because of this new life in Christ, they are experiencing a radical transformation of their identity—as individuals and as a community. These six weeks explore, what it looks like to live rooted in reconciliation, vertical and horizontal with God and with neighbors.

July 28—Sermon: "God's Powerful Love"	Ephesians 3:14-21
God can do things through us we cannot imagine.	
August 4—Sermon: "Bound Together"	Ephesians 4:1-16
God calls us to unity, requiring humility and acceptance of one another.	
August 11—Sermon: "Making Peace"	Ephesians 4:25-5:2
God calls us to make peace, dealing with anger in a righteous, loving way.	
August 18—Sermon: "Overflow"	Ephesians 5:15-20
God fills us with the Spirit, bringing joy and thankfulness to ordinary days.
