PASTOR'S MOMENT

Well, it is official. As of last Sunday at 8:44pm the season of Summer is over and Fall has begun. While we can still expect some warm weather ahead our nights are starting to grow chilly signaling the start of what is, for many, a beloved season of change and transition. Fall is both a time of reflection and of looking forward. In the midst of transition, we have hope and expectation for what may come.

As we have been working our way through the book of James on Sunday mornings we have been reminded of many truths of our faith. James offers pointed commentary and some instruction on topics ranging from faith to wisdom to judgment to favoritism to the power we wield with our words among many other things. One thing James mentions that has some bearing upon this Fall season and

our hope in the midst of transition is an admonition against getting overly caught up in our own, individual, hopes and plans for the future. James reminds us in 4:13-17 that it is

ultimately God who should influence and determine our future. Yes, we have free will to choose our path in life, and the good life, the best life, comes when we are able to align our plans with the directions we sense God leading us. We are called to utilize our free will by asking God first what is good for us and for those around us; allowing and inviting God to hold sway over us, our hopes, and endeavors.

So, as you walk about witnessing the signs of change all around you this Fall,



taking joy in the warm afternoons and chilly evenings, reveling in the smell of wood smoke and hot drinks, remember the source from which that joy comes. God, our creator and sustainer, invites us into the change, to always be growing, shedding the old and embracing the newness of life and retaining that which is eternal; the faith, love, and guiding presence of Jesus.

Thank you to Paul Costales for fixing the top of the riding lawnmower. It's much quieter now, even if it does look a little bit like Frankenstein's monster!






MEN'S GROUP

Another church may be obtaining the building and KCFB will be welcome to stay, if not KCFB will have use of the building through February 2025. At that time, we may be closing. The fee is \$5 per group, per day for use of KCC toys and cleaning supplies. Play time for your group is between 9 am and noon on the reserved day with up to ½ hour afterwards allotted for cleanup. Each group must clean and sanitize all toys, equipment, and tables used during their play time.

The tenth chapter of Mark is a critical transition between the transfiguration of Jesus and the triumphal entry into Jerusalem. After Peter named Jesus as the Christ, the Son of the living God, at the transfiguration, Jesus elaborated on what following him would require. This ensuing journey toward Jerusalem contains a collection of teachings about the nature of true discipleship. It is based on a life contrary to the perspectives and priorities of the world and is more in line with the kingdom of God. In a sense, the values of the kingdom seek to turn the world upside down.
