## 2025 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN



### You make a difference in the spiritual, physical, and mental wellbeing of our family, friends, and community!

Every day we are helping others and there is joy as our involvement is an investment in ourselves too! As part of our 2025 Stewardship Campaign, I ask you to think back at some of the ways you participated in years past and how you witnessed the investment in each other and our church. As you reflect on the impacts you created, I invite you to prayerfully consider what your support of KCC will be for the coming year.

I am so impressed with how we participate with each other in our church community, often times in ways that are not very costly. Your time to send a card, offering prayers, giving someone a call, meeting over coffee, and sharing a ride have a tremendous impact. These examples are highly treasured gifts. This is how we make a difference on a personal level. A specific need in 2025 is your help to fill three positions on our Council. In 2025 there are three Church Council positions open:

#### Council Moderator

(Chairperson) – Approximately 4 hours a month. Primary duties are the creation of the monthly Council agenda, facilitating the monthly Council meeting, leading any Congregational Business meetings, and appointing special committees as needed.

## Council Vice-Moderator (Vice-Chairperson) –

Approximately 4-5 hours a month. Primary duties are to step in for the Moderator in their absence, serving as the point person for any personnel items, and attending monthly Council meetings.

## **Education Chairperson –**

Approximately 4 hours a month. Primary duties are leading the Education Committee (includes children's church and youth programs), attending the monthly Council meeting, and recruiting individuals to assist in Education programs.

We can serve others as given to us in 1 Peter 4:10-11 "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in various forms." We can serve God as the parable in Matthew 25:14-30 shares, where we are encouraged to use our talents for the edification of the Kingdom of God. We can serve the larger church community through sharing of our income to provide a place of refuge and comfort, food for those that are hungry, and providing spiritual nourishment. Finally, we can serve to fulfill our purpose as good stewards to strengthen our relationship and fellowship with each other in our Lord's name.

As we celebrate each day, we get the chance to model and live out the expectations and teachings of Jesus. Lifting others up is so gratifying! Everything you have shared this past year has brought us all together and we rejoice in His presence among us. Thank you for your upcoming participation in KCC for 2025. We will receive and dedicate your pledges of financial support through November 17.




