• ADVENT CANDLE LIGHTING -


Advent season begins on December 1 with our traditional candle lighting at the beginning of the service. If you or your family would like to light the Advent candle(s), please see Pastor Erik.

PASTOR'S MOMENT

It probably feels a bit weird to be seeing Advent candles even before Thanksgiving is celebrated. I am right there with you. Sometimes things in our lives feel a bit compressed, leaving little room to relax and rest. This year we light



the first Advent candle only three short days after Thanksgiving. Can you believe it!?

As we mentally and spiritually prepare for the season of Advent, itself a season of preparation for celebrating the coming of Jesus into the world, we can trust in God's invitation to enter into His peace by way of hope. We will

light the candle of hope and remember exactly in whom we place our hope, the one Isaiah calls Wonderful Counselor, Prince of Peace, Mighty God. In a season where we all need something to hope in and something to hope for the practices of the Advent season invite us to slow down, to look deep inside and to look around ourselves and to believe; to believe that everyone we see, in the mirror, and in one another is someone God loves, someone Christ came into the world to save, someone with God-given gifts and a purpose.

So, as you enjoy time with family and friends this thanksgiving, be thinking ahead in hope for the beginning of Advent. How is God calling you to hope, calling you to make peace, calling you to share joy, calling you to act in love?

Advent/Christmas Series: Living "In Between"

Advent is an in-between time of year. It is not just between Thanksgiving and Christmas, though that is when it occurs. Advent is all about what was and what is to be, about what has already happened and what has yet to occur. It's a time of anticipation, of expectancy.
