PASTOR'S MOMENT

Well, we have made it through the journey of the Lenten season and celebrated the joy of Easter. Now what?

That is often the question on our



minds beginning the Monday after Easter Sunday each year. So much preparation and expectation has been poured into arriving at Easter Sunday we easily lose sight of the reality that Easter is also a season. Just as we were reminded on Sunday that Christ cannot be held captive in a singular location, nor can

the joy of the resurrection be held within a single day of the year. We are Easter people every day. The unique celebration that is Easter Sunday should serve as a reminder and jumpstart to the season of Eastertide that we now find ourselves in. The 50 days following Easter Sunday during which our joy at the resurrection is meant to overflow into the rest of our lives; an extended reminder that it is God's intention for that joy to prevail above all else, to permeate the fabric of our lives.

Again, we may ask, "Now What?" We find ways to let the joy of Easter infect us, inspire us, drive us to positive action, to remind us how wonderful life is and to help us continue to shine a light into the darkness. We remember the fear and trepidation that surrounded the early disciples after Jesus' death and the mystery and confusion surrounding stories and experiences of his resurrection. We remember that the fear and uncertainty did not stop them from acting in faith. They embraced joy and wonder instead of succumbing to fear. They acted. They became the movement Jesus started. They shared the good news. We can continue doing the same. We are Easter people and this is Eastertime.





We all know the excitement and disquiet that come with the sudden reversal of our expectations. The early Christians whose stories are told in the book of Acts have no shortage of surprises. The resurrection sets off a host of unexpected events and changes for Jesus' followers, even changes within themselves. If our own spiritual lives have come to seem humdrum and everyday, these stories will awaken us I a new desire for God's work in the lives of unsuspecting, ordinary people like ourselves.
